Ready Together Emergency Preparedness at the Library –

Unsure where to begin when it comes to emergency preparedness? The library is here to help with a series of programs and tabling events this Spring to educate our patrons on planning for emergencies, as well as providing basic supplies to build Emergency Kits.

In Person Programs include these topics on the following Mondays at 5 pm:

- 2/24 Emergency Food Supply; Work, School & Community; Communications Planning
- 3/17 Getting Involved, Being Informed, and Power
- 4/28 Emergency Supplies and First Aid

If you aren't able to attend a program, drop by or visit the Ready Together Information Booth at the library. We will be sharing more Emergency Preparedness resources on Fridays from 10:15 am to 1 pm on March 7th and May 2nd.

Coming Soon! Storybook SCCLD - Have you ever wondered what the Santa Clara County Library children's spaces would look like if they were transformed into an enchanted children's storybook? You're about to find out!

We are creating new spaces at the library to foster a passion for books and reading while combining play and early literacy experiences. Our new space will include themed interactives for little hands to practice motor skills, reading nooks for quiet play, a toddler slide for active play and an interactive learning area for babies.

Construction for this project will begin in March with a grand opening in mid-April! To keep patrons safe during construction, the children's room will be closed to the public during installation. Access to children's materials will be made available in other parts of the library, and all children's programming will continue.

Our new space will encourage children to use their imagination where our enchanted play spaces come to life. By meeting children in their imaginative worlds, we will provide space where big body play and quiet play work in tandem around early literacy.

Treasurer Report

The FMHL 2024 Year End financial outlook is good with total assets of \$206,874. Our \$50 for 50 Years of Service donation campaign brought in \$5,797. Along with other donations, grants, and craft sales (\$1,761) the total donations and grants are \$11,116. Our hard-working CDs earned interest of \$4,745. Membership dues were \$1,964.

Our sales income (Bookstore cash and credit, Online sales, Big Book sales, and Bargain Books) was \$44,737. Our total 2024 income was \$62,563.

We took advantage of Black Friday savings to upgrade our Sort Room technology. We acquired a new All-In-One computer, a new printer, and a volunteer-donated laptop. This new equipment can double Sorter efficiency.

We are celebrating our ability to support the Morgan Hill Library with a \$24,272 gift (double our initial budgeted donation).

Our net income for 2024 of \$32,224 is made possible by our dedicated Volunteer Sorters, Cashiers, and Board of Directors. Happy New Year.
